General Conditions (0 conditional)

<u>IF clause</u> <u>Main Clause</u> <u>Meaning</u>

Present Simple Present Simple General laws, things that are always true

If an airplane **runs out of** fuel in the middle of the ocean, it **crashes**.

Possible Conditions (1st conditional)

<u>IF clause</u> <u>Main Clause</u> <u>Meaning</u>

Simple Present Will (or can / may / must) + Verb Probable future result

If my flight **is** cancelled, I **will sleep** in the airport.

Hypothetical Conditions (2nd conditional)

<u>IF clause</u> <u>Main Clause</u> <u>Meaning</u>

Simple Past Would (or could) + Verb Imaginary situation in the present or

future

If I had more money, I would buy a helicopter.

Impossible Conditions (3rd conditional)

<u>IF clause</u> <u>Main Clause</u> <u>Meaning</u>

Past Perfect Would have + past participle Imaginary situation in the past

If he <u>had known</u> about the storm, he <u>wouldn't have flown</u> yesterday night.
